The name is James Fanstone He was born in Brazil, from english messionary parents, and grew up in England. He graduated from medical school in the University of London in 1924. After that, he joined the British army where he served until 1919. Then in 1922 he married Ethel Marguerite Peatheld-she was called 'Dona' Daisy here- and the two moved to Brazil and in 1924 they made Golds-Andpolis their new home. In 1927, together they built a hospital-Hospital Evangético de Golds (HEG). He was very much known for his desire to help and to spread the World of God, the once that could pay would be charged for the treatment, but the poor received treatment for free. In the years ahead, they founded an association 'Associação Educative Evengélical -that today is the college I'm studying at- and also created a nursing school (1934) called Escola de Enfermagem Florence Nightingale. Daisy died in 1971 at the age 81. James died in 1987 at the age 97, carrying with Order of the British Empire, received for his work)
